ABOUT US

West Essex Regional High School, located in northeastern New Jersey just 25 miles from New York City, is composed of four municipalities: Essex Fells, Fairfield, North Caldwell, and Roseland. West Essex Regional High School is a public secondary school that is committed to meeting the needs of our students by providing a comprehensive program of studies. In addition to the core required subjects, a wide variety of electives permits individualized programs of study that are engaging and appropriate to each student's interest and needs.

The High School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the New Jersey Department of Education. West Essex Regional High School is a four year comprehensive school housing approximately 1100 students. The Class of 2015 is comprised of 253 students.



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Current seniors are required to earn 135 credits for Graduation, including 20 in English, 20 in Health and Physical Education, 15 in Social Studies, 15 in Mathematics, 15 in Science, 5 in World Language, 5 in Visual or Performing Arts, 5 in 21st Century Life & Career Education and 2.5 in Financial Literacy. They must also pass the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment.

New Jersey Monthly ranked West Essex Regional High School as the 25th top public high school in New Jersey for 2014. “The high school’s Class of 2014 received the highest SAT scores at West Essex in a decade,” West Essex Superintendent of Schools Barbara Longo said. The total mean SAT score for the class of 2014 was 1638, the highest average in more than a decade. Longo attributed the 69-point increase over the 2013 scores to the district’s teaching staff. “While there may be many factors that affect test scores, there is no greater influence on student achievement than great teaching. Congratulations goes to all of the teachers in all subject areas who help make our students critical thinkers.”
