



IN-PERSON/REMOTE LEARNING SURVEY (Jan. 2021)






MP2 ATTENDANCE STATUS

Facility Capacity

- Vast majority of rooms currently hold 10 students with 6' social distancing. NO ADDITIONAL DESKS WILL BE ADDED AT THE TIME.
- Rooms 200, 202, 318, 502, 515 & 805 hold fewer students.
- Classes in room 318 and 502 may require relocation (several options)

Single Cohort Logistical Changes

- All music classes go to the auditorium. 101 and 105 remain mostly open an unused.
- All study halls are combined and moved to Red Cafeteria.
- Library and Black Cafeteria are designated satellite rooms to hold overage from rooms exceeding maximum capacity.
 - Library English, Social Studies, World Language (30 desks, 7 tables. Library remains open as alternate faculty work space.
 - Black Cafeteria Math, Business, Science (40 desks)
 - Possibility of art satellite room in 100s for access to supplies
- Satellite rooms will be cleaned and disinfected between periods.

Single Cohort Logistical Changes

- IF classes exceed maximum capacity teachers will send students to the appropriate satellite room.
- Teachers will rotate which students report to satellite rooms.
- PE / Health classes are not included in overage numbers.

Satellite Rooms

- 106 class sections out of 638 total class sections have slight overages. 16%.
- Some students will never go. On average a student may go once a week. No students will go more than once a day.
- **Example**: At full attendance daily, a class of 12 would send 2 students to the satellite room each day. The same students would rotate back to satellite every 6 days.
- Satellite rooms will have a quiet study hall environment. Students will Zoom in with headphones and participate as they would from home.
